More and more countries are getting involved in celebrating this holiday. The main colour of it is green. It is a jolly and funny holiday.



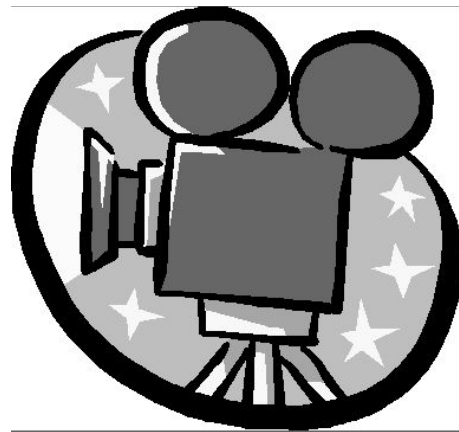

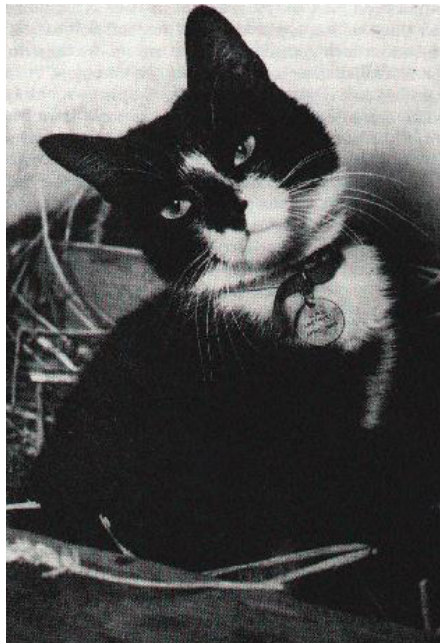
## New Television
